High-pressure sales tactics

Pushy representatives who demand immediate decisions. "Today-only offers" with no chance to review the contract





02

Upfont fees

Requests for large upfront payments without clear services rendered. Promises to sell or rent your timeshare for a fee.





03

Too-good-to-be-true Promises

Guarantees of unrealistic profits or resales.

Claims that they can quickly relieve you of your timeshare obligation.





04

Lack of Transparency

Refusal to provide detailed contracts or legal documentation.

Vague or evasive answers to your questions.





05

Unverifiable Credentials

No verifiable business address, phone number, or legitimate website.

Fake or misleading company names that mimic reputable business.
